Competition other rules

OTHER IMPORTANT RULES :

- Don't forget Your AC on the match → No AC → No PLAY, Official also must give AC
- Player must have the same number for the whole competition!
- Flying GK shirt and Bibs – take Yours but in case OC will provide, put a number on the back before the match and confirm with Referees. For the Final match – FIFA Rules.
- Red Card = minimum 1 match suspension
- If team receives RC → 2 minutes suspension card will be given to the team's representative
- Second Yellow Card = 1 match suspension
- In men and women tournament single yellow cards are erased after the 1st group stage because of not equal number of matches
- One board (clock) is counting from 0 to 20', others from 20' to 0' – don't be surprised ☺



Usefull information

Step by step in the hall

- Receiving the keys to the changing room from Hall Manager
- BEFORE THE MATCH: Confirming the team list received from Match Commissioner (HoD signature)
- AFTER THE MATCH: Carefully reading the Match Record file and accept with signature of HoD
- If team will not show up 15' before the match, the opponent team win with 5:0, if late arrival is not justified.
- Team that is not playing the scheduled match, will be disqualified from the Championship.
- Please don't take keys to changing room with You



Competition format

COMPETITION FORMAT:

WOMEN: two phases (7 days in total), each team will play at least 5 matches during the tournament

1st phase:

playing in groups (2 groups of 4 teams /A, B/ and 2 groups of 3 teams /C, D/) in round robin system (3 days), The winners and runner(s)-up from each group promote to quarter finals.

2nd phase:

Higher rank (places 1-8) → knockouts, no extra time /only in the 1st position match/, 3 penalties (3 days)

Lower rank (places 9-14) → second group stage, round robin system (3 days), matches for placement (1 day)

The 2nd draw will take place on the 3rd day of the competition (place and date tbd).



Competition format

COMPETITION FORMAT:

MEN: two phases (8 days in total), each team will play at least 6 matches during the tournament

1st phase:

playing in groups (4 groups of 4 teams /A, B, C, D/ and 2 groups of 3 teams/E, F) in round robin system (3 days)

4th day is day off for all teams

The winners and runners-up from each group and the best four teams from third position promote to eight finals (only matches against the teams in first and second position are taken into account)

2nd phase:

Higher rank (places 1-16) → knockouts, no extra time /only in 1st position match/, 3 penalties (4 days)

Lower rank (places 17-22) → second group stage, round robin system (3 days), matches for placement (1 day)

The 2nd draw will take place on the 4th day of the competition (place and date tbd).



Competition information

GETTING OFFICIAL DAILY DOCUMENTS (RESULTS etc.):

- Daily documents (all results, statistics, standings, official notes, other important information) will be delivered to the teams by the OC via internet.
- Each HoD and Team's Attache will receive an email with all the details concerning the results and schedule for the next day – please be aware of that and check Your mailbox every morning ☺
- All the official documents and information will be available also at INFO DESK Point.



Competition & trainings

MATCH COUNTDOWN:

- 60' Arrival at the hall: Teams and Match officials
- 50' Team list to be completed and signed by both teams
- 45' to -15' Warm-up on the play court
- 10' Accreditation cards checking
- 8' Teams enter the field of play and stand in line facing the VIP box
- 6' Announcement of the players, coaches and representatives of each team
- 3' Hand-shaking procedure (visiting team starts) and team photos
- 1' Coin toss
- 0' Kick-off
- + 5' signing match record



Competition & trainings

TRAINING SESSIONS:

- Your intension to practice on any next day should be confirmed at the INFO DESK Point to Leonardo. If You don't show up you loose opportunity to train for the end of the competition. You need to give this info evening before!
- Leonardo at the INFO DESK Point has all available schedules for trainings. We use 3 halls for trainings except 18th of July (only 1) because of other disciplines.
- Leonardo is attending this meeting so directly after GTM he is for Your disposal.
- Training session last for maximum 1 hour.



Competition – protest

Head of Delegation may protest in written on behalf of their athletes or team. Protest must be accompanied by a deposit of 200 EUR (refundable if justified) and submitted to the EUSA representative, as follows:

- within 20 min after match on match issues;
- within 1 hour after published official daily sport results and statistics for the published issues,
- whenever during the EUC on non technical issues.

Protest on referee or match official decision is not permitted.

Determination of EUSA Annual Ranking List

- The points are attributed to the teams based on the final standing of the competition. For each NUSA, only the highest placed team gets points. Accumulated points are calculated for NUSA.
- Points accumulated within the last four (4) years determine the EUSA Ranking List, published annually by the EUSA Office.
- Points scheme is published in the EUSA Rules and Regulations for the EUG - Edition 2016, paragraph "EUSA Ranking List" (page 16).

Determination of the seeding for the draw

- The recent National Champion for each NUSA is considered within the EUSA Ranking List. If there is more than one (1) team from the same NUSA, all remaining teams are all together in the last pool for the draw (no difference between them).
- The NUSA National Champion is seeded in accordance with the EUSA Ranking List.



The draw

- The university team of the hosting city or in their absence the hosting country's highest ranked team is already drawn into the group / place A1.
- The remaining teams will be drawn into groups. The draw first will be done for all first positions in groups, then second positions, third etc.
- Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different groups.
