Exceptions from FINA Regulations

EXCEPTION FROM FINA REGULATIONS:

- Dimensions of the playing field – 25 x 20 m
- The duration of the game is four periods of 5 minutes (4 x 5 min)
- Interval: 2 minutes between the first and second period and between third and fourth period.
- Between the second and third period is 4 minutes interval.
- Should the scores be level at full time in any game for which a definitive result is required, there shall be a penalty shoot out to determine the result (semi finals and final).



Competition format

COMPETITION FORMAT – MEN COMPETITION:

- 4 groups of 3 teams
- Semi finals: 1st A vs 1st B and 1st C vs 1st D
- Semi finals: 2nd A vs 2nd B and 2nd C vs 2nd D
- Semi finals: 3rd A vs 3rd B and 3rd C vs 3rd D

COMPETITION FORMAT – WOMEN COMPETITION:

- 1 group of 4 teams
- Round robin system
- After group stage: Final: 1st vs 2nd ; 3rd place: 3rd vs 4th

Competition & trainings

MATCH COUNTDOWN:

- Team should be one hour before their match at the venue
- Warm up starts 35 minutes before the game (diving pool)
- Match protocol 10 minutes game start

TRAINING SESSIONS:

- According the schedule and draw
- Time of each training session – 1 hour
- 2 outdoor swimming pools
- If team will not show up at scheduled training time, and this will not be communicated in advance – this team will lose a possibility to have trainings in all following days.



Competition – protest

PROTEST:

Head of Delegation may protest in written on behalf of their athletes or team. Protest must be accompanied by a deposit of 50 (refundable if justified) and submitted to the EUSA representative, as follows:

- within 20 min after match on match issues;
- within 1 hour after published official daily sport results and statistics for the published issues,
- whenever during the EUC on non technical issues.

Protest on referee or match official decision is not permitted.



Participation in the Competition

Any Participating team or competitor (in individual event), after being confirmed by the draw, **shall participate in all scheduled matches.**

If the team or competitor **misses any of the scheduled matches** (without justified reason announced in advance), **they will be disqualified** from the event and a fine of maximum 500 EUR will be imposed by the EUSA. That University (represented by the participating team or competitor) will not have the right to participate in EUSA events until the fine has been received by the EUSA.

In addition, the SCAC will submit a report to the EUSA EC who may, at their discretion, ban that University from all EUSA events for a period of minimum 1 (one) year. In such circumstances, a report will be submitted to the rector of that University and to the NUSA setting out the reasons for the ban.

It includes checkboxes for the proposer's role (athlete, team official, referee, SAC member, OC member) and the type of award (individual or university team). It also asks for the name of the team and the specific gesture or behavior being proposed. There is a section for a short description and a signature line. At the bottom, there is a small disclaimer: "The EUSA does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage caused by the use of the information provided on this website. The use of the information provided on this website is at the user's own risk."
